Fundraising Tips

Your friends and family love to support your passions and want to see you succeed! Make your appeals personal and show them how much it means to you and how excited you are about it!

Ask them to pledge to you because Pilchuck Audubon:

- Protects birds and other native wildlife in your local communities
- Educates adults and children every year about conservation through classes, events, programs, and trips
- Participates in several community science projects, both locally and nationally, that contribute valuable data to scientists
- Provides classroom conservation grants to local schools for nature- and wildlife-themed projects

And don't forget the birds! It's critical to conserve birds because:

- Birds touch every landscape, from ocean to urban to forest
- Birds are often the first wildlife we're introduced to in our lives and sometimes the only wildlife we see in our daily lives
- Birds play vital roles in every ecosystem on earth including seed dispersal, predator/prey interactions, and nutrient cycling
- And when we protect birds, we protect all life, and that includes people
- 1. Keep everyone posted on how close you are to reaching your fundraising goal. Your friends, family, and coworkers want to see you succeed. In fact, some may donate again if they know you're close to reaching your goal. Share updates on the status of your goal and increase it when you reach it. Then, update your donors and challenge them to help you reach the next level.
- 2. **Tell your story.** How did you get involved in Pilchuck Audubon? How do you volunteer and in what ways has your involvement enriched your life? How have you seen Pilchuck Audubon's programs and campaigns benefit your community and the natural places that surround us?
- 3. **Keep sharing.** Send out updates on your fundraising achievements. Sharing stories makes donors feel a part of your efforts. You may even inspire some of your friends to join your team or to advocate for your campaign.
- 4. Be creative! Here are just a few ways to involve others in your campaign: <u>Enlist Your Friend Circle:</u> If you work in an office, live in a dorm, participate in a club, or play on a team, convince the whole group to raise funds to make even more of a difference. When you reach out to your separate social networks, the possibilities are endless! <u>Make Birthdays More Meaningful:</u> Are you or someone you know about to celebrate a milestone birthday? Ask your friends to donate the amount of the age instead of a gift. <u>Recognize Mother's Day/Special Events:</u> Ask for donations in lieu of gifts for an upcoming wedding, anniversary, retirement, or other special day.
- 5. Use social media sites including Facebook, Instagram, and Twitter. Talk about your campaign and goals and include a link to your fundraising page. Use social media to share your stories and make others feel more involved in your Birdathon. Create your own Facebook fundraiser for Pilchuck Audubon. Be sure to tag Pilchuck Audubon in all of your Birdathon posts so we can share it, too!
